

What's the craic? The Leprechaun's Stolen Gold

An interactive Kids Mystery Party game (Approx. 10-14 years old)

Here's how to organize the investigation:

Before the party: (be sure to review the Bonus Pages (pages 18-21)

1. Print off one copy of the suspect roles (pages 8-15).

2. Print off enough copies of the notes, diagram and answer sheet (pages 4-7) so that everyone who is investigating the mystery has a set. You can, at your discretion, make "clipboards" by stapling these pages to sheets of cardboard.

3. Print off the solution (pages 16-17) and the crossword puzzle solution (page 22); keep it hidden.

#### At the party:

1. Assign the roles to eight suspects. Everybody else becomes private investigators hired to solve the case. No information needs to be memorized because each suspect has notes containing their answers to their questions.

2. Read "The Gold is Gone" and "Rules of the Game" (pages 2 & 3) out loud to everyone.

3. Distribute the notes and answer sheets and puzzle page to the investigators. The investigators will need to make notes to collect information. If the suspects are also investigating the events, they'll also need clipboards.

4. Tell the kids to talk with each other to find out what everyone knows about the events. You can organize this if you want to, or you can just let it happen.

5. When time's up (after an hour or so) gather everybody together and, one at a time, ask them the questions on the answer sheet.

6. Read the solution to the crime. You may want to award a prize(s) to the person(s) who came closest to the correct answers.



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
### The Gold is Gone!



Now morning has broken. The town has been locked down and searched, but no sign of the gold has been found yet. Nobody has left, which means the culprit and the gold are still in the town somewhere. The suspect list has been narrowed down to eight people who could have had the opportunity to perpetrate the theft last night. There's the owner of the local inn and Leppy's older brother Ian Cohen; the Cohen Inn's server Todd Waits; the travelling musician Melody Bard; Leppy's mother and general old lady Mama Cohen; the town groundskeeper Clipper O'Toole; the retired town Leprechaun and Leppy's mentor Paddy Day; the mysterious stranger Danny Drifters; and even Leppy Cohen himself.



Be sure to ask:

1. Who are you? 2. Where were you last night? 3. Who do you think did it? 4. Where do you think the gold is hidden?

#### \*You were seen at the inn last night. What were you doing there?



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
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
